Eligibility Requirements:

Must be a Senior at RBR, graduating in June 2026

Must be pursuing higher education with a 2 or 4 year college program (Associates or Bachelor's Degree)

Must demonstrate the need for financial assistance with higher education

Scholarship Details:

\$3000 each year will be awarded to one student for 2 or 4 years, depending on the college degree program (up to a \$12,000 commitment to the student over 4 years)

The \$3000 payment will be paid directly to the college or university each year
